Summary of Act 130, SLH 2016: Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development

<u>Purpose</u>: To coordinate and facilitate state agency transit-oriented development (TOD) planning, and facilitate consultation and collaboration between the State and counties on TOD initiatives.

Role:

- 1. Serve as the State's TOD planning and policy development entity with representation from State, counties, and the community.
- 2. Formulate and advise the Governor on the implementation of a strategic plan for TOD projects, including mixed use and affordable and rental housing projects, on State lands in each county.
- 3. Facilitate the acquisition of funding and resources for State and county TOD programs.
- 4. Monitor TOD plans, including site or master plans and implementation plans.
- 5. Review all CIP requests for TOD projects.
- 6. Recommend policy and statutory changes and resource strategies for successful execution of the plan.
- 7. Consider TOD initiatives in other states that have demonstrated positive outcomes.

Strategic Plan:

- 1. Coordinate with county TOD efforts.
- 2. Inventory State, county, and private TOD projects and identify infrastructure needs.
- 3. Facilitate the development of TOD projects, including affordable and rental housing on State lands.
- 4. Identify and prioritize State financing for infrastructure and facilities needed for TOD projects.
- 5. Promote public-private partnerships for affordable housing on State lands in TOD areas.
